2. HAZARD IDENTIFICATION

Signal Word. Danger
Hazard Statement. Causes eye, skin and mucous membrane burns.
Precautionary Statements. Wear protective gloves and eyewear protection. Do not breathe dust/mist. Wash thoroughly after handling.
Acute Effects
Eyes. Causes eye burns. Contact with eyes may cause severe irritation and possible burns. Eye exposure may cause severe and permanent eye injury (blindness).

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Eye Contact. Check for and remove any contact lenses. Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes, occasionally lifting the upper and lower eyelids.
Skin Contact. In case of contact, immediately flush skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing and shoes. Wash clothing before reuse. Get medical attention if irritation persists.
Inhalation. Move exposed person to fresh air. Flush mouth and nasal passages with water repeatedly. Get medical attention immediately.
Ingestion. Wash out mouth with water. Do not induce vomiting unless directed to do so by medical personnel. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If affected person is conscious, give plenty of water to drink, get medical attention immediately.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Suitable Fire Extinguishing Media. Use water spray, fog or foam.

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6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Spill Clean Up: Move containers from spill area. Vacuum or sweep up material and place in a designated, labeled waster container. Dispose of via a licensed waster disposal contractor.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Handling: Put on appropriate personal protective equipment (see Section 8). Do not get in eyes or on skin or clothing. Avoid breathing dust. Do not ingest. Keep in the original container or an approved alternative made from a compatible material, kept tightly closed when not in use. Do not reuse container. Wash thoroughly after handling.

Storage: Store in original container protected from direct sunlight in a dry, cool and well-ventilated area, away from incompatible materials (see section 10) and food and drink. Keep container tightly closed and sealed until ready for use. Contains moisture-sensitive material. Store in a dry place. Do not store in unlabeled containers. Keep out of the reach of children.
